I realized that learners also need to be trained in the structured rigors of problem solving through creativity, innovation, and design. I proposed and launched a new organization within the University with the express purpose of starting a new campus wide innovation center and design school. I recruited people to this vision from all over campus, working across an array of disciplines. After several years of concerted, patient, behind-the-scenes efforts we successfully solved for all the major impediments to significant change at BYU (1) no new funding, (2) no new space, (3) no new faculty slots, and (4) no new programs. We found a donor who was willing to contribute

\$15MM with the promise of more (he is worth several billion dollars). We collaborated with the library, who was willing to repurpose thousands of square feet for a new innovation space. We identified more than 80 existing faculty and staff on campus who were already involved in teaching, researching, and leading in creativity, innovation, and design. And we identified more than 200 already existing courses on campus on the topics of creativity, innovation, design thinking, and entrepreneurship.
