Public service motivation has enjoyed remarkable attention and development. Even still, one might argue that PSM stands at the threshold of a new generation of development. Recent critiques (e.g., Bozeman & Su, 2015), reviews (Ritz, Brewer & Neumann, 2016; Christensen, Paarlberg, & Perry, 2017), and special issues (e.g., Yang & Xu *IPMJ* 2013; Boyd *PMR* 2018) all underscore potential avenues of development.

The purpose of this conference is not only to enhance and extend current trajectories, but especially to challenge and elevate the next generation of public service motivation research and applications. To this end we'll feature a diversity of scholars, prominent practitioners, and working sessions.

The conference organizers will be seeking proposals of several varieties from new and established contributors across the globe:

- individual research papers
- panels (multiple research efforts coordinated around one or more themes)
- idea **incubators** (sessions flexibly designed to move embryonic ideas that add to our stock of knowledge through development; participation/collaboration—both prearranged and spontaneous—is encouraged in these sessions)
