What can I do with a minor in business?

Manage and problem-solve. Business professionals thrive in a business environment by gaining a basic understanding of the core areas of business, such as accounting, finance, human resources, marketing, and supply chain management.

Work in a business setting. If you are interested in contributing to or working with businesses but not necessarily in starting your own, this minor may be for you. The minor is designed to help you develop a foundational business acumen and navigate the functions, departments, and jargon of the business world.

What will I learn?

Develop a broad business background. You'll be introduced to a variety of areas of study, enrich your understanding of business operations, and develop targeted skills to support your interests. You'll learn firsthand from experts in the field and apply your knowledge in a hands-on experience course.

How can I use the minor to enhance my BYU degree?

Apply these skills to your area of study. Acquiring business skills and applying them through experiential learning will help you work for or engage with businesses as you pursue your intended career path. The curriculum adds value to the technical knowledge gained from your major and allows you to select electives that align with your interests and career goals.
